Early in Catherine's adult life, while she was still living at Coolock House, a young servant girl came to her door seeking protection from the master of the house where she was employed. Catherine tried every avenue she knew of, to find the young woman a safe place to stay but found her efforts blocked at every point by the rigid procedures and delay of the organisations set up for that purpose.

Green light for McAuley's Safe at Home

This month, McAuley Community Services for Women celebrated the Victorian Premier's announcement of \$6 million in funding toward the pilot of a new initiative called *Safe at Home*.

Safe at Home is an early intervention model, transforming the default system where women 'escape' violence and become homeless. Under the program, women are instead supported to stay home or in their communities safely, while ensuring accountability for the person using violence.
